

EMOTIONAL & SPIRITUAL CARE PROVIDER CREDENTIALING

Introduction:

This training program equips individuals to serve as credentialed responders after disasters and other traumatic events. Approved instructors use standardized, recognized curricula and resources developed by the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF), Adventist Community Services (ACS), and others. While recognized ACS community partners may attend training events, ACS credentials are issued to Seventh-day Adventist members in good standing. Students are able to receive credentials at the following three levels of recognition:

Emotional & Spiritual Care Provider I:

Ecclesiastical Endorsement as Community Chaplain (Disaster Response):

Issued by NAD Adventist Chaplaincy Ministries (ACM) to qualified Adventist pastors in collaboration with Adventist Community Services.
